The Parable of the Sower

1Again For ver. 1-12, see Matt. 13:1-15; Luke 8:4-10 he began to teach beside the sea. And a very large crowd gathered about him, [ch. 3:9; Luke 5:1-3] so that he got into a boat and sat in it on the sea, and the whole crowd was beside the sea on the land.

- In chapter 3 Jesus was teaching in the Synagogue but has now changed his tactics and gone out to the masses.
- Jesus went from the house of worship, to the community and then got in a boat
 - Teach at church, hometown, and take the gospel to the world.
 - The Jewish people could not be complacent and keep the words Jesus was teaching to themselves

2And ver. 33 he was teaching them many things in parables, and in his teaching he said to them:

- Parable "earthly story with a heavenly meaning."
- 3"Listen! Behold, [Isa. 55:10; Amos 9:13] a sower went out to sow. 4And as he sowed, some seed fell along the path, and the birds came and devoured it.
- Path- think about footpaths you have seen or traveled along.
 - Sometimes there is not grass growing if it is a high trail of travel
 - The first paths like this I remember seeing was at my grandparents' house
 - One of my cousins lived right next door and there was a path beaten out running between their houses.
 - The ground has too much traffic to be concerned with absorbing seeds being thrown on it without loosening the soil.

5Other seed fell on rocky ground, where it did not have much soil, and immediately it sprang up, since it had no depth of soil.

6And James 1:11 when the sun rose, it was scorched, and since it had no root, John 15:6 it withered away.

- Rocks- rocks drain water fast and has light sand/soil around them.
 - Things can grow in this, but when the rain stops and the hot sun comes out for a few days, these plants are dried up and die.

7Other seed fell among Jer. 4:3 thorns, and the thorns grew up and choked it, and it yielded no grain.

• Thorns- The soil here has so much growing on it already there is no room for the new plants to gain access to the sun light.

8And other seeds fell into good soil and produced grain, growing up and increasing and yielding thirtyfold and sixtyfold and ver. 20; Gen. 26:12 a hundredfold."

Good Soil-

9And he said, See Matt. 11:15 "He who has ears to hear, let him hear."

The Purpose of the Parables

10And ver. 34 when he was alone, those around him with the twelve asked him about the parables. 11And he said to them, Matt. 19:11; Col. 1:27; [1 Cor. 2:6-10; 1 John 2:20, 27]; See Matt. 11:25 "To you has been given See Rom. 16:25 the secret of the kingdom of God, but for 1 Cor. 5:12, 13; Col. 4:5; 1 Thess. 4:12; 1 Tim. 3:7 those outside everything is in parables, 12 Isa. 6:9, 10 so that "they Deut. 29:4; Jer. 5:21; Ezek. 12:2; Rom. 11:8; 2 Cor. 3:14; 4:4; [Isa. 42:19, 20] may indeed see but not perceive, and may indeed hear but not understand, lest they See Luke 22:32 should turn and be forgiven."

- Parables were not intended to be understood by everyone.
 - They were intended to be understood by those listening with spiritual ears.
- This sounded strange to me the first time I realized it.
 - I thought messages should be told so that all who heard them could understand them.
 - But Jesus gave messages that those who were there searching for spiritual answers not entertainment.

13 For ver. 13-20, see Matt. 13:18-23, Luke 8:11-15 And he said to them, "Do you not understand this parable? How then will you understand all the parables? 14 [Matt. 13:37; John 4:36, 37] The sower sows ver. 33; ch. 2:2; Luke 1:2; Acts 8:4; James 1:21 the word.

He's sowing the gospel, the good news

15And these are the ones along the path, where the word is sown: when they hear, Satan immediately comes and takes away the word that is sown in them.

Path-

16And these are the ones sown on rocky ground: the ones who, when they hear the word, immediately receive it [ch. 6:20; Isa. 58:2; Ezek. 33:31, 32; John 5:35] with joy. 17And they have no root in themselves, but Gal. 1:6; [Hos. 6:4; Gal. 5:7] endure for a while; then, when tribulation or persecution arises on account of the word, immediately See Matt. 11:6 they fall away. 4:17 Or stumble

Rocks-

18And others are the ones sown among thorns. They are those who hear the word, 19but See Matt. 6:25 the cares of 2 Tim. 4:10 the world and 1 Tim. 6:9, 10, 17; [ch. 10:23; Matt. 19:23; Acts 5:1-11; Heb. 3:13] the deceitfulness of riches and the desires for other things enter in and choke the word, and it proves unfruitful.

• Thorns-

20But those that were sown on the good soil are the ones who hear the word and accept it and Hos. 14:8; John 15:5, 16; Phil. 1:11; Col. 1:6 bear fruit, ver. thirtyfold and sixtyfold and a hundredfold."
